


#### **Museum Highlights**

We have another new addition you will want to check out inside the museum. We have installed a new interpretive board – Women Who Kept the Lights. Many people don't know that over 150 women in this country were official, paid head lighthouse keepers, starting as early as the American Revolution. Most received their appointments when their husbands or fathers died while tending their lights. The Lighthouse Establishment had no pensions, so this was their way of looking out for the families and most of these women had actually spent years prior helping to do the job, anyway. #### The Eagle Has Landed—New Outdoor Signage!

The Eagle has Landed! At least the eagle on our outdoor interpretive sign is now on display with all the other wildlife on Cape Canaveral. This sign joins four others that cover plant life on the Cape, Native Americans, living on the Cape as an early settler, and the full layout of the Cape Canaveral Light Station when all the buildings were still present. This was a labor of love over many months by our volunteers and made possible by a generous grant from the Florida Lighthouse Association. Installation Day found our (younger) friends from the Coast Guard Chief's Mess digging post holes and pouring concrete for us. Special thanks to the Coast Guard: Landon F. Coleen Seitter grew up on the barrier island when her Air Force father was transferred from Kadena AFB, Okinawa to Patrick AFB in 1960. She went to almost all the schools in Satellite Beach and Indialantic, as new ones were built almost every year and new school lines were drawn, graduating from Satellite High School in 1970. She then went to Nashville, TN for her collegiate years, graduating from Trevecca Nazarene University (B.A.), Middle Tennessee University

(M.Ed.), and Vanderbilt/Peabody (Ed.S). She stayed in Nashville for several years working with special needs adults but moved back to Indian Harbour Beach in 1979 to join her family's business.

In 1981, she joined the Army Reserve as a Military Police Officer, working her way up to become a Criminal Investigator with Army CID. Army CID investigates any felony with an Army nexus, but is also the lead agency for the personal protection for the highest level of personnel in the Department of Defense---Secretary of Defense, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs, Secretary of the Army, etc. Personal protection was her specialty, and this included close-in protection, motorcade movements, hotel security, foreign governments liaison, coordination with Navy NCIS & Air Force OSI, etc. She traveled the world on protective service missions, but her two favorite missions were the 50th Anniversary of D-Day (Portsmouth, England) and the 60th Anniversary of D-Day (Normandy, France) due to interaction with WWII Veterans.

Coleen was assigned to Army Reserve CID units in the role of Operations Officer and Commander. She was assigned to units in Jacksonville, Boston, and Phoenix

and after 9/11, was constantly mobilizing individual Soldiers and her units to Washington, D.C., Iraq, and Afghanistan. She retired as a Chief Warrant Officer 3 in 2012 and moved home to Indian Harbour Beach.



She jumped right in volunteering with the Sea Turtle Preservation Society and the Brevard's Zoo Sea Turtle Healing Center, transporting sick and injured sea turtles and caring for them at the Zoo. She also volunteers at Sebastian Inlet State Park.

Having visited a plethora of lighthouses in New England when she was stationed there, Coleen joined the Florida Lighthouse Association. It was at one of their quarterly meetings in the Panhandle that she met Rocky and Lisa Johnson who told her all about Cape Canaveral Light. Even though she had lived in the area since 1960, she had never heard about it! She joined Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation in 2017 and volunteers in the gift shop, as an escort, and is trying to learn the brick program under Ann Bolton's tutelage. She loves our Light and is so proud of the new buildings and the wonderful work of all the volunteers! We are privileged to have Coleen on our team.
