Message from Our Foundation President



I hope everyone had a great holiday and happy new year. I would like to say thank you for your support to the lighthouse during 2021 which was a challenging year. That said, in 2021 the lighthouse was visited by 2148 visitors from 41 states and we now have 545 members. The continued support by our sponsors, donors, members and volunteers allows the foundation to fulfill our mission of preserving the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse, promoting public awareness and making the full restoration of the lighthouse grounds a reality, while educating our youth and providing public access to this unique national landmark.

Due to the generosity of our 2021 sponsors, members, and private donors, we were able to keep the light shining during the pandemic. We opened the keeper's cottage doors to celebrate the opening of our Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Museum and Gift

gift shop. In a continued challenge to return to normalcy we held our annual Descendants Day and Volunteer Appreciation Day. In October we held a very well attended fundraiser at the American Muscle Car Museum in Melbourne. We finished 2021 with the lighthouse being included on the Museums of Brevard Holiday Tour of Historic Homes. We are working with Brevard County Schools to begin field trips to the lighthouse again. Prior to the pandemic our history education program had surpassed hosting more than 800 fourth graders from Brevard County Schools on field trips.

In 2022 we expect a full return to normalcy and will host Sponsor Appreciation Day, Descendants Day, Volunteer Appreciation Day, a fund raiser at the American Muscle Car Museum and a 5K/10K race which will begin and end at the lighthouse.

As a final thought I want to say thank you to our members, the brick owners, and our sponsors who provide the funding to keep the light shining. I hope each and everyone of you take advantage of the opportunities to visit the lighthouse and museum which continues to evolve and exist due to your generosity. Another Important Happening


Keep Brevard Beautiful has selected the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse as its very first participant in a new program called Adopt-a-Landmark. Working with experts, including Sally Scalera, an urban horticulture agent and master gardener coordinator for the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agriculture Sciences, we are developing a landscaping plan around the cottage that focuses on historical accuracy, Florida friendly plants, ease of upkeep, and low-cost implementation. We hope to have the implementation completed in the spring in our first steps in beautifying the light station.

Volunteer Spotlight on Todd McDowell



Todd McDowell has been a Brevard resident a total of 27 years. He was stationed on the CGC Diligence and Vigilant from 1990 – 1992 and then back to Station Port Canaveral as an Electronics Technician from 1992 – 1996. While an ET at Station Port Canaveral, one of Todd's duties was to

maintain the LORAN repeater that was housed in the lighthouse as well as the fenced in area that held the antenna. He also assisted with maintaining the radar system in the lighthouse that was used for tracking vessels offshore during Shuttle launches. Todd grew to become very fond of the lighthouse and recognized the importance of preserving its history.

After completing his service, he and his wife, Jennifer, moved to Georgia. After graduating Culinary School in Atlanta, they moved to Athens, so Jennifer could complete her degree in Dietetics. Upon her graduation they moved back to the Atlanta area and Todd completed his B.S. from Georgia State. Now with two small children (nothing like being full time students, working full time and having two kids at the same time!!) they moved back to Brevard to be near Jennifer's family in 2000.

After the Lighthouse Half Marathon in 2019 Todd was introduced to volunteer opportunities at the Lighthouse. He signed up to volunteer and served some time helping in the Keeper's Closet. He was eventually asked, and accepted, to serve on the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation Board of Directors. Currently he serves as the 2nd Vice President.

Todd co-owns Alpha-Omega Training and Compliance ($\Omega\Omega TC$) and Salvation Safety. A ΩTC is a full-service Environmental Health, Safety and Emergency Response company based out of Cocoa with its main Emergency Response office In Newberry. Salvation Safety specializes in providing high level safety professionals and confined space rescue attendants to its clients in North, Central and South America as well as the Caribbean.

Todd and Jennifer have three children, Richard "Christos", Brianna and Ellieana. All three also reside in Brevard County.

Todd has been a consistent supporter of the Foundation by generously sponsoring events and willingly aiding when various jobs needed to be done. We are fortunate to have Todd on our team.

Women Who Kept The Lights



When you visit the Museum be sure to see our the new Women Who Kept the Lights board. These two examples highlight the tremendous contribution of women who kept the lights shining.

Very often the wife of children of keepers served as unofficial assistants. Robert Ranson, husband of Frances Burnham's daughter, relates in his book East Coast Florida Memoirs how Frances served as assistant to her father Mills Burnham a Cape Canaveral in the early 1850s. Frances also married Henry Wilson, who was an Assistant Keeper for several years both before and after the Civil War, though he was gone for the war years, fighting for the Confederacy. Frances likely continued to help her father and her husband for many years. Although no women held official, paid positions as Cape Canaveral Keepers, hundreds of women at other lighthouses did. The Women Who Kept the Lights board tells several of their stories. If this captures your interest, buy the book of the same name, available in the Keeper's Closet gift shop.

Next up with our Women Keepers is Ida Lewis, who served as keeper of the Lime Rock Light in Rhode Island from 1857 to 1911. Ida was the most famous lighthouse keeper of her time, male or female. She took over from her disabled father at the age of 15. She was also an expert rower. Her lighthouse was along exceptionally treacherous waters, and she is credited with saving at least 18 lives by rowing her boat out to rescue foundering sailors in all types of storms. She received the Congressional gold medal and the highest award of the US Life Saving Service. She was on the cover of many magazines and newspapers in her era, with several famous paintings done of her rescues. In 1924, the Lighthouse Service changed the name of the light to Ida Lewis Rock Light Station. This is the only time in US history any such honor was ever paid to a keeper.
