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

Message from Our Foundation President



I hope our members have been doing well as the challenges of the pandemic continue. It has been a busy month at the lighthouse as we continue to navigate the COVID Delta variant. The Space Force and Foundation hosted our annual Descendant's Day visit to the Space Force Station and Annual Lighthouse Day.

The descendants were very appreciative of the opportunity to pay respects at the grave-sites, visit the lighthouse, and Space Force Hangar C Museum. We had 64 attendees that ranged in age from 98 to 3. The families represented 4 lighthouse keepers, and 4 generations. Colonel Edward Marshall welcomed the descendants on behalf of General Purdy, and provided an update on the Space Force's mission and upcoming launches. I personally enjoyed the opportunity to speak with several families who shared the personal experiences of relatives who had lived on this historical property.

The Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation is celebrating our 153 year history with a fund raising event **Save Our History** at the **American Muscle Car Museum (AMCM)** on **October 23rd from 6-8:30pm**. This collection of over 500 cars ranging from classic 1950's to today, including rare collectibles, is not open to the public. 

Museum Highlights

We are fortunate to be able to remain open during the continuing issues surrounding the pandemic. The Space Force requires masks to be worn inside the museum and lighthouse, regardless of vaccination status, but can be removed outdoors when walking around the light station grounds. We are being careful to maintain physical distancing so everyone will be comfortable coming out.

Descendants Day provided a rare treat for the docents to be the receivers rather than the sources of great stories about the lighthouse. The families enjoyed sharing little-known anecdotes about their ancestors living on the Cape, that the docents and volunteers loved to hear. They also shared some wonderful photographs and documents that we hope to use in future publications.

In concert with International Lighthouse Weekend, we hosted the KSC Amateur Radio Club who were on site both Saturday and Sunday, August 21/22, to reach out to lighthouses around the world. Our special lighthouse-only tour visitors were able to see them in action. We also welcomed a tour from our fellow Museums of Brevard members and their families. There were representatives from a dozen different museums across the county and a great time was had as they toured the lighthouse and museum. A big thanks to fellow MOB member, Jamie Draper, and his Air Force Space and Missile Museum for co-hosting and making their great Hangar C rocket garden available for viewing.

In partnership with Keep Brevard Beautiful, we are the first participants in their new Adopt-A-Landmark program. We will provide guidance on historic plants and the vision for placement so as to recreate the look and feel of the landscaping on the station during the time of the lighthouse keepers and their families. Did You Know?



Volunteer Spotlight on Barbara Moser



When we think of Barbara Moser we immediately think of the saying “if you need a job done and done right ask a busy person”. Barbara has been a ready volunteer for the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation, willing to take on any task with enthusiasm. Barbara graduated from Auburn University in 1966 with a Bachelor’s Degree in Secondary Education. She began her career teaching history at Eau Gallie High School. Through her roommate, another Eau Gallie High teacher, she met her husband, Enoch, who had come to Brevard County two years earlier to work as a NASA engineer in the Apollo Program. Her teaching career was with Brevard County schools where she taught social studies for a total of twenty years separated by a 19-year period as a stay-at-home mom.

In 2002, Barbara became a member of the first group of docents to give tours at the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse. In 2019, she joined the committee formed to develop the displays in the new Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Museum. Her main job involved the historical research necessary to tell the Lighthouse story. She also worked on editing and proofreading the museum boards as they developed. Barbara supported other projects which were involved in the museum development, tours at the Lighthouse and working with school groups. Barbara currently represents the Lighthouse Foundation as a docent at the lighthouse exhibit at the Brevard Museum of History and Natural Science in Cocoa and as a member of the MOB (Museums of Brevard) organization.

In 2010, she became a guide at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station for the Air Force Public Affairs Office. These tours include original launch complexes for the development of the U.S. ballistic missile program during the 1950s and 1960s and complexes used in the development of the Manned Space Program.

Barbara joined Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) in 2007. During her membership in two different chapters, she served as Recording Secretary, First Vice Regent, Regent and currently as Historian. She has chaired the Constitution Week Committee, the Christopher Columbus Essay Contest, the American History Essay Contest, the American Indian Committee and is currently the chairman of the Conservation Committee.

Barbara’s favorite pastime is genealogy. She is currently working to document and expand research done by her sister in the 1990s and to document multiple DAR patriots in her family. She also enjoys reading and sewing.

Due to Covid, Enoch and Barbara have not been able to travel in the last year. In 2018, they took a river cruise on the Seine River in France and in 2019 a river cruise on the Rhine River from Switzerland to the Netherlands. Their travels are usually trips to Gadsden, Alabama to spend time with their two daughters and their families. Enoch and Barbara have been married fifty-three years and have ten grandchildren.



A Venue for Special Gatherings and Events



In celebration of International Lighthouse and Lightship Day on August 21, the local **Kennedy Space Center Amateur Radio Club** set up in the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Museum for a robust day of transmitting and receiving calls from around the world. During the day long event, Scott Vengen, Jim Hale and Mike Williamson logged 725 calls from 45 States, 24 countries and 4 continents. Brigadier General Steve Purdy, Commander, Space Launch Delta 45, and also a licensed Amateur Radio Operator stopped by with his wife and daughter to join in the operations. CCLF volunteer Liz Gravuer spent several hours with the group, and offers the following accounting.

“It was very interesting observing the radio operators. The General, who enjoys the hobby, stopped by with his wife and daughter. They allowed the General's daughter Holley to try her hand at transmitting with the help of a script. She did excellent for a novice! The calls are very brief, the object is to log as many contacts as you can. Each licensed operator has a call sign. KSC Amateur Radio Club is N1KSC, and our Lighthouse number is US0099. The radio operators act as a team, one to transmit



and one to record the call via computer log. Once you find an open frequency that is not busy, you broadcast by saying CQ, CQ,CQ and your call sign (CQ means "search you" and is calling for a station). A contact responds by saying their call sign, which you verify and log. (A computer program is able to identify who and from where they are by their call sign and logs the call.) When using call signs, you use the International Telecommunications Union Standard Phonetic Alphabet. So, for example, N1KSC would be said "November One Kilo Sierra Charlie". The call is ended by saying 73 which stands for "Best Regard". Of course, this is very simplified, as there are many other codes and procedural etiquettes that are used while speaking on a call, and a lot of technical knowledge needed to tune the radio and antenna.

They were getting a lot of contacts from the MidWest and Canada (SD, IL, OR, AR, etc.) while Holley was transmitting. After she left, the airwaves went quiet for a while until they turned the antenna around 4 PM to pick up a different band wave, and they started to receive international traffic. The majority of the calls came from

Scotland, Wales, Italy, Rome, Germany, Poland, Turkey etc., but there were many other countries and islands. We did get some Lighthouse contacts also, which were logged. Scott had some contacts that he was familiar with and chatted slightly longer on those. Besides picking up calls from the large stationary antenna, they also had a hand held antenna that they were able to pick up calls on from a satellite as it passed overhead. Amateur Radio Operators are important in that they can provide auxiliary communication services for military, federal, civil and disaster officials during times of emergency. Also on August 21, members of the **Museums of Brevard** made a caravan visit to the lighthouse to celebrate the special day.

And earlier on July 10, Gordon Ewell led a group from the **Camera Club of Brevard** for tour of the Space Force Station which included a stop at the lighthouse.

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
