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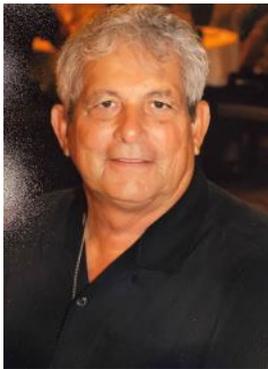

Message from Our Foundation President



We are nearing the end of a long, hot summer with Labor Day just around the corner when we celebrate the backbone of our country, the hardworking people that keep our economy going. At the lighthouse we just completed two major projects: the handrail replacement on the cottage, and the oil house modifications for display of the DCB-224 Aerobeacon. In addition, we won a national innovation award from Keep America Beautiful for our landscaping project which was led by Keep Brevard Beautiful. We are in the final stages of planning for our fundraising event at the American Muscle Car Museum scheduled for November 5th.

The handrails on the Keepers Cottage had deteriorated to the point that they were an eyesore and unsafe. We contracted with Kinley Construction to have them replaced with a synthetic product which should look pristine far into the future. A big thanks to Jim Crisafulli for completing the project so quickly with minimum disruption.

Our old DCB 224 Aerobeacon is now on display in the Oil House. The project was made possible by the our volunteers especially Becky Zingarelli for her coordination with the Space Force, Jim Underwood for his coordination of USCG volunteers who readied the lighthouse for the beacon, and finally our contractor Glenn Clutter of GC Electric who donated the time and materials to complete the upgrade. We now have a professional display and access for visitors into the Oil House. Please make a trek to the lighthouse to see the beacon.

The American Muscle Car Museum, owned by Mark Pieloch, is opening the doors once again for a fund raising event for the Foundation on November 5. Last year we had a tremendous event raising over \$25,000. Our theme this year is "A Beacon of Brevard History" which highlights the lighthouse's importance to the history of the Spacecoast. Tickets are \$100 each, and are available through Board members or [eventbrite.com](https://www.eventbrite.com) or email cclighthousefoundation@gmail.com. The flyer for the event is in the back of the Beacon. We hope to see all of you there for hors d'oeuvres, wine and good times. Let's make this event even bigger than last year to help keep the light shining.

My wife and I have been working off our bucket list, and went to South Africa on a photo Safari. We saw the lighthouse at Cape Point, the southern most point in Africa which was first lit in May 1, 1860. The lighthouse is located on a bluff 775 ft above sea level and is accessible by a funicular which exits into the original lighthouse keepers cottage. As always, it amazes me how important lighthouses were for shipping and commerce around the world. The lighthouse sections were forged by the Victoria Foundry in London and transported to Cape Point for the installation which began in 1850.

As always, I want to say thank you to our members, to the brick owners, and our sponsors who provide the funding to keep the light shining. I hope each and everyone of you take advantage of the opportunities to visit the lighthouse and museum which continues to evolve and exist due to your generosity. Museum Highlights

After nearly a year of working on it, we have realized our dream of opening the oil house for the public to enjoy! While visitors have been able to peer inside through the doorway, they are now able to step into this circa 1894 structure for the first time. They can get up close and personal with the DCB 224 aerobeacon that served as the Cape Canaveral light from 1993 until 2021. They can read the interpretive signs explaining all the lights used in the iron lighthouse since 1868, as well as how the oil house was utilized to support the light. They may even still detect the telltale odor of the fuel stored in this building over the past 129 years. All of this was made possible by many dedicated CCLF volunteers who helped create and realize the vision, Coast Guard volunteers from Port Canaveral who helped dig the trench to lay electrical conduit, and Glenn Clutter of GC Electric, who donated his time and materials to bring light into the oil house so it is safe to enter. We hope you enjoy this new experience the next time you visit the lighthouse.

Did You Know?

We know how difficult it is to take in all the historic information on the interpretive boards inside the museum and lighthouse during a typical, time-restricted tour. In an effort to share everything we've learned and now know about the Cape Canaveral Light Station, we have uploaded pdf files onto our website for over 95% of our signage. Oil House

Built after the lighthouse was moved here in 1894, the oil house initially stored kerosene used to illuminate the 1st Order Fresnel Lens.

The oil house is 18 ft. high, 225 sq. ft.



Storage Tanks

In 1931, two large tanks fed fuel to generators to power the light. They were removed when commercial electricity arrived in the 1950s, and the oil house was then used for storage as well as lifesaving equipment.



A brick walkway placed around the oil house in the early 20th Century forms the bow of a boat, easily seen from the top of the Lighthouse.



The roof was lost in a storm in the 1970s. It was not replaced until 2003 when the building was restored as close as possible to its original 1894 design.

Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Restorations and Upgrades

Out with the Old, In with the New Handrailing...

Beautiful, new railing is now a reality around the Keeper's Cottage and Restrooms! Due to issues with the original wood material used for the railings on both buildings, the railings started to deteriorate almost immediately after installation in 2019. We were unable to successfully remediate the problem over the ensuing years. After the railings deteriorated beyond repair, the Foundation decided there was no alternative left but to replace them. The work was completed on August 5th and we now have durable pvc railings that look like the originals around both buildings. A big THANKS to Kinley Construction for all the work they did to make this happen, and not trampling our new, award-winning landscaping in the process!

In addition to our new members, there were also thirty-two (32) renewals to date, one of whom, Bob Thornton, is now a Lifetime member in remembrance of his wife, Yvonne, who recently passed away. Yvonne was not only a founding member and an original Board member of the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation, but she was also a direct descendant of our early Lighthouse Keepers and Assistant Keepers (Mills Burnham (Keeper), Henry Wilson (Asst), and Clinton Honeywell (Asst & Keeper)). Clinton Honeywell was Yvonne's grandfather; it is his life-size likeness displayed in the museum for use as a photo op. She was an active participant in our annual Descendants Day event. We will miss Yvonne's sunny smile and willingness to share the lighthouse story.

Since January, 52 members have not renewed for a variety of reasons; this isn't a large number, but I thought I'd take some time with this column to write about the importance of membership, and why we join and renew.

Why do people join organizations? Some join professional organizations for networking opportunities. For others it may be a "brother/sisterhood" of mutual interests; they join because they enjoy being with people with like interests, i.e. the Shell Club, car clubs, and lighthouse organizations. 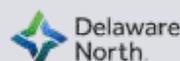
