2023 was a good year for the Lighthouse, and 2024 looks like it will be even better. In 2023 we had over fifteen thousand visitors which was an increase of over seven thousand from 2022, thanks to Space Force family day which was estimated at ten thousand visitors. Our educational tours doubled from two in 2022 to four in 2023. So far in 2024 there are three educational tours scheduled for January with more to follow.

I want to thank all the docents and volunteers because without your dedication to excellence we could not have welcomed as many visitors as we did and still receive the many positive comments.

One event that did not happen in 2023 was our 10K/5K race due to late approval and not enough time to make it a good event. We started a lot earlier this year and the race is scheduled for March 24, 2024. As soon as registration opens, we will notify everyone.

Other upcoming events in 2024 include but are not limited to: Florida Lighthouse Association meeting at the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse on February 2 & 3, Descendant's Day on March 9, member/brick owners caravan on March 16, an old fashion picnic at the Lighthouse in June/July and the member/volunteer appreciation picnic in the fall.

Museum Highlights

The museum has been hopping this holiday season, hosting tours from multiple school groups, community groups, Canaveral Tours guests, and participants from the 4th Annual Museums of Brevard Holiday Tour of Historic Homes. All enjoyed the many new and returning holiday decorations.

On Sunday, December 17th, as the heavy rains were ending and the final Museums of Brevard Holiday Tour of Historic Homes was ending, a picture-perfect moment occurred at the lighthouse. A spectacular end-to-end rainbow framing the Light Station was seen by all – a fitting ending to our 2023 Holiday Tours!



Did You Know?

Our historian, Barbara Moser, documented information about oil distribution inside the lighthouse: The system for delivering the oil to the lamp room consisted of a fixed support (davit) above the door to the third level to which a block and tackle could be attached for hoisting the barrels to that level. From there they were lifted through a series of trap doors to the 6th level, which served as the "oil room". These trap doors could also be used to move furniture or other items from level to level. A trap door in the floor of the third level allowed such items to be lowered to the second level kitchen and bedroom areas. Each day the amount of oil needed for the night was transferred to a brass transfer can which was carried from the 6th floor oil room to the lamp room. After an exterior oil house was constructed at the new lighthouse site following the 1894 lighthouse move, oil could be stored and hoisted up as needed.

Volunteer Spotlight on Michele Giger Rohrmann

Look at the landscape around the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse keeper's cottage and you will see a bit of Michele Giger Rohrmann's touch.

She is pleased to have helped to add a bit of magic at the lighthouse after ending a 35-year career as a manager of some of the beautiful gardens at Walt Disney World. There she helped produce topiaries, containers and hanging baskets.

Rohrmann still has a deep desire to continue to ensure a great experience for guests through her many roles with the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation. It is an attribute she brings from her Disney experience in a career she loved. That drive is noticeable in her volunteer work. She is co-chair of the lighthouse tours committee.

In addition, Rohrmann contributes to the lighthouse educational tours, climbs to the top of the lighthouse and assists with group tours by working with a great team of escorts.

"I especially appreciate the diverse group of people that I have met, who share their amazing stories of military, space and history of this wonderful property," she said.

She began the career she calls "nothing short of amazing" as a landscaper in New Jersey, where her summertime job turned into a lifelong endeavor after earning a degree in ornamental horticulture. She moved to Florida to be able to garden all year and had her first roll call as a gardener near the steps of Disney's Cinderella's Castle in 1985. That's where she met her husband, Rick, an arborist manager and now also a Disney retiree. He helps with tree maintenance at the lighthouse.

Rohrmann said one of her proudest moments was being a part of the pioneers of Epcot's first Flower and Garden Festival.

Since her retirement from the Disney horticulture team, she has immersed herself in volunteerism. In addition to the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse, she has served with Meals on Wheels, does community service with Space Coast Parrot Heads Club and some work at the Brevard Zoo.

Filling the voids left after retiring from a job she loved, Rohrmann says she loves music, playing pickleball and her dogs ----- Leisea, a Labrador retriever and Bean, a German short-hair pointer.
