

# Message from Our Foundation President

Now that we are in the long, hot, lazy days of summer, what is your Board of Directors doing? We are getting ready for our big fundraiser, Christmas in July, on July 18, 2024, at the Rising Tide Tap & Table in Port Canaveral from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM. Only 250 tickets are available for a requested donation of \$100. The ticket not only gets you and a guest into the event but also a chance to win the \$5,000 first prize or the \$1,000 second prize. You do not need to be present for the first prize, but you need to be present for the second prize. Tickets are available and you can contact any CCLF Board member to get your tickets. In the March Beacon, I mentioned that a Return-on-Investment study was being done so CCLF could qualify for a TDC Capital Facilities Grant from Brevard County. CCLF received the report on June 12, 2024, and there were some interesting findings. Out-of-county visitors to the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse spent \$3,001,500 on Florida's Space Coast on accommodations, restaurants, shopping, and other items in the last 12 months. Out-of-county visitors to the Lighthouse generated a total economic impact of \$4,652,400 in Florida's Space Coast last year. Taxes paid on accommodations used by out of county visitors to the Lighthouse brought in \$55,100 in Tourist Development Tax in the past 12 months. The above figures are based on 9,500 out-of-county visitors to the Lighthouse last year. The report stated that the Lighthouse generated 9,050 room nights last year with a projected increase to 9,500 in 2024 and this is without the two new cottages.

With the two new cottages it was projected that out-of-county visitors to the Lighthouse would stay an additional 1,460 nights. It was estimated that they will spend an additional \$650,100 on accommodations, restaurants, shopping, and other items per year, this would generate an additional \$45,507 in taxes each year.

Senator Debbie Mayfield sponsored a Florida Senate bill for Cape Canaveral Light Station Reconstruction – phase 2 for \$650,000. CCLF was notified by Senator Mayfield's office, in January that it was part of the approved budget that passed the Florida House and Senate. However, we learned on Wednesday June 12, 2024 that the appropriation was vetoed by the Governor along with all of the other Cultural grants / appropriations. So now the CCLF grant committee is working on a Capital Facilities Grant from the Brevard County Tourism Development Office. We will persevere until we get the cottages built, and long thereafter.

# **Museum Highlights**

August is always an important month for lighthouses and Cape Canaveral is celebrating twice this year! National Lighthouse Day is on Wednesday 7 August and International Lighthouse and Lightship Weekend is August 17-18. We will be offering free caravan tours on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> for the public to come out and cele-

On the public tour on the 17<sup>th</sup>, the KSC Amateur Radio Club will once again be operating from the lighthouse museum. Visitors can listen in while they broadcast and receive hundreds of messages from other lighthouses and lighthouse enthusiasts around the world. The lighthouse can only be accessed through a tour. Reservations are required at least 7 days prior, and space is limited. If you'd

### Did You Know?

<u>National Lighthouse Day</u> is an annual commemoration of the anniversary of the federal lighthouse establishment and a day to celebrate lighthouses and the commitment and service of those who tended America's lights for generations. For the bicentennial of the U.S. Lighthouse Service in 1989, Congress declared National Lighthouse Day on August 7 -- the date in 1789 that the Ninth Act of the First Congress, establishing federal control of lighthouses, was passed and signed by President George Washington. National Lighthouse



Day was again declared by Congress in 2013, but efforts to place this date on the official national calendar have been unsuccessful, to date.

International Lighthouse and Lightship Weekend (ILLW) is an annual event held on the third full weekend of August each year. The event was the brainchild of John Forsyth and Mike Dalrymple who were members of the Ayr Amateur Radio

Group in Scotland. The event, which started in 1998, has developed into an international gathering of amateur radio operators

from an estimated 95 countries. Their objective is to promote public awareness of lighthouses and lightships and their need for preservation and restoration, to promote amateur radio and to foster International goodwill.

# Welcome All Brevard K-12 Students


We are participating in a new initiative through the Museums of Brevard with Brevard County Schools to



encourage every Brevard student, K-12 in every public, private, charter and home school, to visit museums in Brevard. The tours are part of a multipronged initiative created by the Education and Citizenship Armed Forces Coalition of the Space Coast (ECAC).

"ECAC will kick off a passport program providing students with avenues for additional learning opportunities and community service options throughout the summer. This passport program will steer the students of Brevard County to attend 10 out of the 24 local museums in Brevard, encouraging museum attendance while giving our students valuable teaching lessons outside of the classroom." To support this initiative, we have added 2 free public caravan tours for students during each of the summer months and monthly tours the other months of the year.

Other initiatives besides museum attendance include scholarships from local veterans organizations, STEM education outside the classroom, and augmentation of citizenship education inside the classroom. We hope to see many of our Brevard County students and parents at the lighthouse!

# An EAGLE Has Landed...

On Saturday, June 15<sup>th</sup>, Stephen Bohlin officially became an Eagle Scout! We were very fortunate that Stephen chose the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse for his Eagle Project. After a year of planning, preparing, and fundraising (nearly \$3,000), Stephen led a group of 25 volunteers on February 17<sup>th</sup> to install a new fence to help deter visitors from walking on the archaeologically sensitive grassy areas by the lighthouse. Stephen also purchased and installed new crushed shells along the path leading from the street, as well as under our outdoor signs and benches. At his Honor Court, Foundation President, Ron Ecker, and Muse-um Director, Becky Zingarelli, presented Stephen with the American Flag and Lighthouse Pennant that had flown at the lighthouse in his honor on February 17<sup>th</sup> while the work was being done. The docents are especially appreciative of Stephen's efforts as the fence has virtually eliminated the need to chase visitors off the grass! Big things are in store for Stephen as he takes the honor of being an Eagle Scout into the rest of his life. He will always have our appreciation and admiration. Way to go, Stephen!

### **Stephen's Eagle Trail**

Stephen Bohlin's Scouting adventure began in 2013 with Pack 1103 at Stanley Elementary School in Katy, TX, later moving to Pack 711 in Maple Valley, WA. His dedication to Scouting was evident early on, earning his Arrow of Light award and crossing over into Troop 711 in 2018.

After Stephen and his family moved to Florida in 2021, he joined Troop 321 at Rockledge Methodist Church. He continued to demonstrate exceptional leadership and commitment by serving as Senior Patrol Leader for multiple terms, Den Chief for Pack 738, and Chief of Kikape Chapter. Currently, he holds the

position of Historian for Tipisa Lodge, Order of the Arrow. Stephen's leadership and service exemplify the true spirit of Scouting.

Stephen's Eagle Scout Service Project for the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation epitomizes his unwavering dedication and tenacity. Over the course of nearly a year, he intricately mapped out plans, mobilized resources, and galvanized a team of volunteers to fortify and enhance their cherished historic grounds. On February 17th, bolstered by the support of 25 committed volunteers, Stephen achieved a remarkable feat: the installation of a new fence, safeguarding archaeologically delicate zones, and the meticulous placement of 12 tons of crushed shells to elevate the visitor experience along pathways.

# Keeping the Light Shining Membership Musings



July already! This is the month we in the USA celebrate our independence in becoming our own unique nation. Happy Independence Month, USA!

Your CCLF Membership Committee decided it would be appropriate to celebrate this momentous occasion with a convoy for our members and brick owners on 6 July. The cut-off to reserve a spot in the convoy was 26 June, but hopefully those who wanted to participate were able to sign up and enjoy the patriotic theme of RWB decorations, light refreshments, and music.

1776 represents the year of our independence, and 72 years later the first Cape Canaveral lighthouse was built at the Canaveral point standing 65' with the focal point of 55' through which shown the Winslow-Lewis lamp. Not high enough nor bright enough, Cape Canaveral received the current cast iron lighthouse with a First Order Fresnel Lens 20 years later in 1868. (Learn about this and more at our museum standing adjacent to the lighthouse).

Although it was removed from the tower in 1993 due to damage from frequent launches, our First Order lens is still available for viewing, just not at Cape Canaveral. To view this magnificent lens, you will need to visit the Ponce Inlet Lighthouse in Ponce Inlet (New Smyrna/Daytona). There it was "restored" and is on display in their lighthouse lens museum. It is so well worth the trip and admission to see how large and beautiful it is...this is the definition of a working work of art. While there, you will see lots of other apparatuses used in keeping our early mariners safe in treacherous waters.

Unfortunately the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation was not granted the requested budget appropriation from the State to build the final two cottages at the lighthouse (see President's message), so as members we will continue efforts to raise funds through other avenues: grants, donations, fund raisers, etc. Speaking of which, there are still tickets available for the *Christmas In July* fundraiser at the Rising Tide on 18 July. If you would like a fun time with lighthouse friends, good food and beverages, consider a donation of \$100; you could come away a winner of  $1^{st}$  prize (\$5,000) or  $2^{nd}$  prize (\$1,000). It only takes one ticket to win... Hope to see you there ... in Christmas attire if you're brave enough.



We thank you for the support you have provided to allow us to continue to educate the public about the importance of lighthouses in our maritime history and to honor the lighthouse keepers and their families that endured hardship and danger to provide a beacon to seafarers.

### CCLF Board of Directors Strategic Update for Members

The CCLF was formed in 2002 to assist the Air Force (now the Space Launch Delta 45) in preserving, protecting, promoting, and interpreting the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse and its historical significance to the Florida Space Coast, State of Florida, and our nation. Over the years the Foundation has relied on its members and volunteers to accomplish many of its goals. As we have progressed, funding for the restoration of the lighthouse community and meeting operational expenses is increasingly challenging. Because our lighthouse is located on a secure military installation and access is restricted, options for fundraising are limited. Funding for building the first of the three cottages came from grants from the Tourist Development Council through the Brevard County Commission and the State of Florida. An important factor in obtaining funding/grants is a committed membership. In addition to major construction costs, membership dues are used to meet our operational and maintenance expenses.

Your CCLF Board is in the process of seeking funding for Phase 2 to complete the original footprint of the lighthouse community, and as a member, you are a large part of it since a key parameter in this endeavor is a strong CCLF membership.

Two buildings were completed in 2019: the "Head Keepers' Cottage" which became our museum, and a "maintenance building" which is our restroom facility. Both buildings replicate a part of the original footprint of the light station, although with different purposes. We are now seeking funding to build the 1<sup>st</sup> Asst. Keepers' Cottage and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Asst. Keepers' Cottage to complete the community as it once was.
