I hope everyone had a Merry Christmas and will enjoy a Happy New Year. For the Lighthouse Foundation, 2024 was a roller coaster year. Early on, we learned of several legal documents with the Space Force that needed updating. Fortunately, the SLD 45 Legal Office collaborated with us in correcting the documentation, and permitted us to continue operating tours of the lighthouse and the gift shop. Next, it looked like we were going to get money from the State to complete Phase 2 of the Cottage Restoration Project. Unfortunately, this appropriation was vetoed in the final budget signed by the Governor. However, when one door closes another one opens. We applied for and received a Tourist Develop-

ment Council Capital Facility Grant from Brevard County for \$775,000. So the year turned out to be great, with the Lighthouse ready to launch into the next phase of building out "What was once, will be again!"

As we enter 2025, I am positive this year will be better than last year. With our legal issues behind us, and assurances of collaboration from the Space Force leadership, I am confident we can resolve any new issues that might arise. We expect to start construction on the two new cottages in the Spring / Summer with construction taking about nine months and the outfitting taking about three months. That puts the grand opening in the Spring / Summer of 2026.

The Lighthouse Foundation could use your help during the various events we have scheduled in 2025. At the present time we have Descendants' Day scheduled in March. We need a volunteer with a four-wheel drive to help get the older descendants back to the cemeteries and grave sites. This is a big day for the descendants since they only get to visit the grave sites once a year. **Please let us know if you are available to help.**

This summer, we will hold our Third Annual Christmas in July Fundraiser. Please let us know if you are available to help.

Most importantly, I would like to thank everyone who volunteered their time and effort to enable the lighthouse to have a successful year. I am not going to list everyone because there would not be enough space in this newsletter. Your personal contributions are all significant and sincerely valued.

Museum Highlights

Museums of Brevard Holiday Tour Highlights

Cape Canaveral Lighthouse once again participated in the annual Museums of Brevard (MOB) Holiday Tour of Historic Homes.

For the 5th year of this event, the MOB decided to mix it up. In past years, visitors would purchase tickets and be able to visit all seven of the historic homes. However, it was proving to be a challenge to ticket holders to be able to schedule that many visits during the holidays. This year, the MOB



significantly reduced the price and allowed visitors to pick as many as three of the historic homes for \$30 and add the lighthouse for another \$10. This approach proved to be popular, and it was a record breaking year for the number of tickets sold!

In addition to the MOB Holiday tours, other visitors from mid-November through mid-January were able to enjoy the light station all decked out in holiday cheer.

Did You Know?

The soil on Cape Canaveral is sandy and not conducive to growing too much, but the early European settlers managed to grow quite a bit for themselves and some for sale. These included corn, beets, carrots, cabbage and sugar cane. Fruit trees were plentiful, such as oranges and peaches, while some keepers also grew pineapple.

It's believed that Keeper Mills Burnham created a sweeter type of orange when he combined two varieties in his orange grove along the Banana River side of the Cape. Tobacco was another crop that seemed to thrive in these conditions.

In addition to what they grew, they also maintained livestock. Chickens, turkeys, ducks, hogs and sheep were among the most popular. Keeper Burnham also bred horses which he sold.

2024 has been quite the year for the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation (CCLF). During the year there were two strong fundraisers, Christmas In July (in July, of course), and the American Muscle Car Museum (AMCM) Race to Make History event in November. But, the cherry on top was in September when CCLF was awarded a grant from the Tourist Development Council, approved by the County Commissioners. Our members came out strong on all fronts and were greatly supportive of the grant process as well as the fundraisers. Your support is invaluable!

Currently the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse Foundation is about 647 members strong, not counting a good number of new members who joined through the American Muscle Car Museum fundraiser in November. The fundraiser was held on 30 November, leaving limited time to complete Christmas shopping, so we have not yet entered all the new members into the system, although some have been added; it takes time to ensure addresses, phone numbers and email addresses are entered correctly. Until the final count is in for the new AMCM members, we have 38 new members (there are plenty more) and 42 renewals.

In December, there were two Member/Brick Owner convoys to the lighthouse. Ordinarily there is one convoy per quarter, but the additional convoy was added to include not only our established members, but also those who became members by purchasing Christmas In July tickets. A trip to the lighthouse during the holidays was part of the event, but we had to wait for the holidays. Both convoys proved to be quite popular with sign-ups.

Members and Volunteers Appreciation lunch. In early November, we had a good turn-out for our members and volunteers appreciation lunch. Volunteer Spotlight on Mark Tomassone

Mark Tomassone — a docent at the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse — was one of the top three volunteers on the Space Coast last year.

Tomassone was one of three finalists for *Florida Today*'s Volunteer of the year for 2024 in Brevard County and named Brevard Zoo's Volunteer of the year in 2021.

There is no doubt why he would receive such accolades. He is an enthusiastic volunteer who certainly makes a difference in his community.

In addition to his 700 volunteer hours last year at the Brevard Zoo and his work at the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse, Tomassone gives his time to the Daily Bread. He helps people in need select clean clothes and hygiene products and schedules others for counseling.

At the zoo, Tomassone manages one shift of volunteers each week, works in the education department and helps with special events.

He also helps adults with literacy skills through Literacy for Adults in Brevard, where he previously served on their Board of Directors. He has been meeting with some of the same students for more than three years.

Some people spend a lot of time on hobbies or recreational pastimes, but Tomassone gives back to the community he has called home since 2018.

"I don't play golf and we live in Florida," Tomassone said.

Born and raised in New Jersey, he earned a degree in marketing from Seton Hall University. Tomassone worked in human resources for McGraw-Hill Publishing, Version, and Columbia University. He retired at 51 and moved with his wife Nancy to Atlanta for a few years before coming to Brevard County.

After moving here, he took a tour to the lighthouse and knew he wanted to get involved. He soon became a docent.

"Five years later I'm still here," he said. "Recently, I've been helping with the school groups, which is really enjoyable."

Tomassone is a certified Top Tour docent who helps as a tour escort for groups. He has been volunteering at the lighthouse for over four years.

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Work has been proceeding over the past few months since we were awarded the grant money from the TDC and County Commission for construction of the new cottages. The architecture review to finalize the drawings is underway.

Preliminary work to prepare for outfitting both cottages is also in process. We've been fortunate to have Linda and Tom Swenson of Lady "S" Antiques volunteer to help us evaluate the period furnishings we will be putting into the Replica Cottage. Along with

other volunteers who have an affinity for antiques and knowledge of keeper's cottages of the period, we will be determining which furnishings will best help us tell the story of the Cape Canaveral Lighthouse keepers and their families from the late 1800s through the early 1900s.
